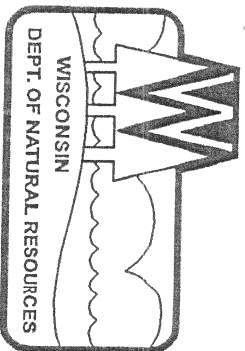

The Division of Water is conditionally approving plans for a sanitary sewer extension at Superior, Wisconsin, submitted under the seal of Charles Robert Inglimo, Professional Engineer, CRI Engineering, Superior, Wisconsin, and received for approval on March 26, 1999.

The sanitary sewer extension will be installed in an alley between Baxter Avenue and Lamborn Avenue and will extend from the existing 54-inch diameter combined sanitary/storm sewer immediately north of 58th Street to 57th Street.

The sewage treatment facility to which this sewer extension is tributary is maintaining appropriate effluent standards. There are known locations in the sanitary sewerage system subject to Category 1 bypassing. However, the City has agreed to a court approved stipulation and schedule to correct the Category 1 bypassing. Therefore, pursuant to NR 110.05(3)(a) and (5)(f), Wis. Adm. Code, the City is eligible for sewer extension approval on a case-by-case basis.

The proposed sanitary sewer extension will be tributary to the existing combined sewer overflow (CSO) wastewater treatment facility #5 in the City of Superior. CSO #5 has been previously identified by the Department as subject to Category 1 bypassing based on the definition in NR 110.05(2)(b), Wisconsin Administrative Code. Therefore, the service area tributary to CSO #5 is under a sanitary sewer extension moratorium. In consideration of the minimal sewage flow contribution initially for this extension, the Department hereby grants a variance to allow installation of the proposed extension at this time. However, the proposed extension will be allowed to serve only the one existing residential establishment located at 1415 N. 58th Street in the City of Superior until the Department determines that the Category 1 bypassing has been corrected at CSO #5. (Refer to condition #5 below.)

The plans and other reports on file with the Department were used by the Department as the basis for conditional approval.

The plans are hereby approved in accordance with s. 281.41, Statutes, [formerly s. 144.04, Statutes], as attested by affixing on the plans, the stamp of approval Number 99-0463, subject to the following conditions:

1. That a preconstruction conference be held to familiarize the construction contractor(s) and resident inspector(s) with the erosion control and dewatering requirements and all other provisions and conditions of the approved plans and specifications.
2. That erosion control methods be used to prevent siltation to lands and waterways adjoining the construction area. These methods shall include



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but not be limited to the following:

- a. Siltation fences,
 - b. Trench stabilization, and
 - c. Immediate mulching and seeding.
3. That a competent resident inspector be provided during the course of construction.
 4. That all storm and other clear water including that from sump pumps, roof drains, cistern overflows, and building foundation drains be excluded from these approved sanitary sewers, that street and building sewers be laid in such a manner as to minimize entrance of groundwater (ILHR 82.36(3)(c)1., Wis. Adm. Code), and that the building sewers and drains be installed to conform to the state plumbing regulations (ILHR 82.40(8)(c), Wis. Adm. Code).
 5. That the proposed sanitary sewer extension initially serve only the existing establishment located at ~~1415 N. 58th Street (Ms. Roxie Hoffman residence)~~ in the City of Superior. The Department may consider future proposals to allow connection of new additional establishments to this proposed sanitary sewer extension after correction of the Category 1 bypassing situation at CSO #5.
 6. That the improvements be installed in accordance with the plans and specifications, and the above conditions, or subsequent essential and approved modifications.

The Department has the authority under ss. 281.19(1), 281.17(8) and 280.11, Statutes, [formerly s. 144.025(2)(c) and (t) and 162.01, Statutes], to adopt rules for the construction, installation, use, and operation of practicable and available systems and for obtaining drinking water for human consumption. Chapters NR 108, 110, and 811, Wis. Adm. Code, have been adopted by the Department pursuant to this statutory authority. The Department has the authority to approve, conditionally approve, or deny plans under s. 281.41, Statutes, [formerly s. 144.04, Statutes].

The plans and specifications have been reviewed in accordance with s. 281.41, Statutes, [formerly s. 144.04, Statutes] for compliance with Chapters NR 108, 110 and 811, Wis. Adm. Code (or any other applicable section of the Wisconsin Administrative code or Statutes which may be specifically referenced in the conditions above). This letter should not be construed as an approval for activities requiring approval under other Statutes or by other federal, state or local agencies.

The Division reserves the right to order changes or additions should conditions arise making this necessary.

If you believe that you have a right to challenge this decision, you should know that Wisconsin statutes and administrative rules establish time periods within which requests to review Department decisions must be filed.

For judicial review of a decision pursuant to s. 227.52 and 227.53, Statutes, you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to file your petition with the appropriate circuit court and serve the petition on the Department. Such a petition for judicial review shall name the Department of Natural Resources as the respondent.

To request a contested case hearing pursuant to s. 227.42, Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to serve a petition for hearing on the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources. The filing of a request for a contested case hearing is not a



prerequisite for judicial review and does not extend the 30-day period for filing a petition for judicial review.

This notice is provided pursuant to s. 227.48(2), Stats.

In case construction of this improvement has not commenced or contracts awarded to complete this improvement within four years from this date, this approval shall become void. After four years a new application and plan submittal must be made and approval obtained of this or other plans before any construction work is undertaken.

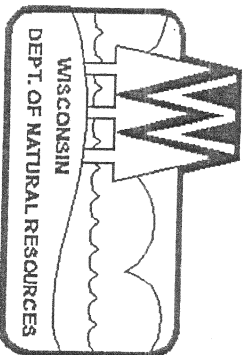

The Department may consider future proposals to allow connection of new additional developments to this proposed sanitary sewer extension after correction of the Category 1 bypassing situation at CSO #5.
